*Ballot by Mail – Election is **all** by mail and **no**-in person voting will take place. All eligible voters will receive a ballot by mail whether or not they request it. Ballots must be returned by U.S. Mail

(postage pre-paid) or dropped off at one of the drop box locations, or returned to a ballot replacement site no later than 7 PM election day. Note, however, all counties have one or more ballot replacement centers where voters can go pick up a ballot and turn it in (Maricopa even calls this “in-person ballot replacement voting”).

*Polling Place – Voters on the Active Early Voting List will receive a mail in ballot. Those not receiving a mail in ballot must vote at their assigned polling place on election day.

*Vote Center – Voters on the Active Early Voting List will receive a mail in ballot. Those not receiving ballots can vote in person at any vote center in the jurisdiction (ballot drop boxes will also only be open in jurisdictions with elections).

Vote by Mail Deadlines:

October 27, 2023 – Last Day to Request a Ballot by Mail or Replacement Ballot for all mail elections (after this date must go in person to replacement ballot site)

October 31, 2023 – Last Day to Mail Back Ballots (after this date drop off in person at drop box or replacement ballot site)

November 7, 2023 – Ballots must be dropped off by 7 p.m.

Other Deadlines:

October 10, 2023 - Voter Registration Deadline

October 11, 2023 – Voting Begins

November 3, 2023 – Last Day for Early in person Voting (for counties with in-person voting)

November 7, 2023 – Election Day

Eday Polling Hours:

For those counties with in-person elections, polls are open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day. Don't forget ID!

Notable Changes from FAQs:

ID Requirements: To vote in person, voters need a valid (i.e. not expired) government issued ID that includes voter's name, photo and the address on voter registration (such as an Arizona driver's license, Arizona ID card, tribal enrollment card, other federal, state or local government ID with name, photo, & address). If the ID is expired or the address on the ID does not match the address see lists of alternative IDs here: [ID at the Polls List | Citizens Clean Elections Commission \(azcleanelections.gov\)](#).

Many of FAQs will not be applicable to vote by mail only elections.
