Internal 49, AL 10/22:

Header: Naturalized Citizen Voter Purge Halted

Language: 10/22 Alabama SOS instituted a voter purge program to prevent noncitizen voting. This has been enjoined the program through election day, and county election administrators must send notices to voters who were included on a list of noncitizen voters, among other actions.

Voters flagged under this removal program should be (1) notified that the Court has halted the voter purge program through election day, (2) told that they should have received a letter from their county registrar confirming that they are actively registered to vote, and (3) told that they should contact their county registrar if they are still showing up as inactive or not on the voter registration list.

Header: No Drop Boxes in Alaska for Statewide Elections

Language: 10/22 Stand-alone drop boxes are not permitted under Alaska state law. Use of drop box in 2020 was an emergency COVID measure only. News here:

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Language: 10/17/24: Alaska's mail ballot requires two (2) first-class stamps due to the size of the envelope.

Advise callers to place 2 first class stamps on their mail ballot.

Do not forget to have the signature witnessed, to sign the envelope, and have the witness sign and date the envelope.

(Note: the USPS will still deliver ballots with insufficient postage).

The Arkansas Department of Finance & Administration announced that tens of thousands of registered voters who had updated or changed their information while at a revenue office may not have had those updates made.

Header: Federal Judge Blocks Rule to Use Electronic Signatures on Voter Registration Forms

Language: 9/4/24:

A federal judge on Thursday temporarily blocked a new rule barring the use of electronic signatures on Arkansas voter registration forms, excluding certain state agencies. State lawmakers in May approved an emergency rule from the Arkansas Board of Election Commissioners that requires a “wet signature,” meaning signing with a pen on voter registration applications unless they’re completed at state agencies (e.g. the DMV).

Online registration is now allowed again in Arkansas after the temporary stay of wet signature rule.

Language: 9/4/24: **Judge rules in favor of electronic voter registration signatures**

A federal judge made a ruling blocking the implementation of a new rule barring the use of electronic signatures on the Arkansas voter registration forms except at certain state agencies. The law blocked was from state lawmakers which required only a wet signature (signing with a

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pen) on voter registration applications unless completed at a state agency office, identical to the DMV.

Header: Judge Bars Restrictive Voter Registration Rule

Language: 9/3: **Online voter registration is allowed again after a temporary stay of a wet signature rule.**

A judge in Arkansas has temporarily stopped the implementation of a voter registration rule that would impact voter registration accessibility. The barred rule required a wet or physical signature on voter registration applications unless completed at a state agency office, such as the DMV.

Header: Inactive Voter Status

Language: 10/17: **If an inactive voter presents to vote, the person will be allowed to vote but will need to affirm their address. If the voter's residential address has changed, see AZ FAQ 8.**

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An inactive voter is someone for whom undeliverable mail triggered an address confirmation notice to which the voter did not respond within 35 days. After two (federal) general elections on the inactive list, the inactive voter will be removed from the voter rolls and would need to re-register. **Voting in the November 2024 election will automatically change the registration status from “inactive” to “active.”**

Submission Feed Line #12, AZ, 9/13:

Header: Additional Citizenship and Residency Proof

Language: 9/13/24 **Arizona STATE registration forms require voters to submit documentary proof of citizenship (DPOC).**

Forms submitted without DPOC will be in suspended status. The voter has until 7pm on Election Day to provide DPOC to the County Recorder in order to complete their registration and cast a ballot.

As long as they submit the registration by Oct. 10 deadline, they will still be able to complete their registration and vote a full ballot in this election so long as they provide DPOC by 7pm on 11/5.

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Temporarily Displaced Voters

- Keep current address and use it to vote, OR,
- Re-register with a temporary mailing address. Ballots can be sent to (1) a friend's address (2) a P.O. Box (3) a voter's work address OR,
- Use Remote Accessible Vote-by-Mail (RAVBM): voters may access and mark a ballot on a computer with internet access using RAVBM. Language: 10/21 In Florida, returning a Vote-by-Mail ballots requires postage in only some counties. Typically, the envelope requires two (2) first class or forever stamps. Postage is required in Sarasota, Manatee, Pasco, Hardee, Highlands, and Hernando Counties (Tampa area). News here

Language:**10/7:** An inactive voter remains **eligible** to vote until they are removed from the official list of registered voters. Removal of inactive voters **does not occur during the 90-day window before a federal election.**

An **inactive** voter is someone for whom undeliverable mail triggered an address confirmation final notice to which the voter did not respond within 30 days or which came back undeliverable. When that happens, the voter is designated as inactive. If after two (federal) general elections, the inactive voter fails to vote, change/update his or her voter registration record, or request a vote-by-mail ballot, the inactive voter is removed no later than the end of the calendar year.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If someone's registration status appears as “pending,” then the caller needs to be told to provide [documentary proof of citizenship](#) to their [County Election Office](#) in order to be taken off the pending list. HOWEVER, it is best practice to advise callers to bring proof of residency with them to register just in case.

Header: Absentee Ballot Envelopes Sealed

Language: 10/19/2024: Absentee ballot packages include two envelopes: an inner envelope that holds the ballot and where the voter includes a copy of photo ID or an exception form, and an outer pre-addressed envelope that the inner envelope is mailed in.

IF BOTH ENVELOPE SEALED - Voters should request a new absentee ballot from county board of elections. NOTE: If there is a risk of the ballot not arriving in time to be mailed back and received by the board of elections by Election Day, the voter should try to vote during early voting or plan to vote in person on Election Day.

IF ONLY ONE IS SEALED - Voters may cut open one envelope and use the other to mail back the ballot. Voter should tape the other envelope closed.

Advised (not required) initial or sign note affirming that they, the voter, are the ones who have unsealed and resealed the ballot envelope.
