## WE DECIDE OUR FUTURE.

This 2026 election season, Black voters and other voters of color are facing increased threats to our access to the ballot box. The federal government and many state lawmakers are attacking our voting rights so that they can hold on to power at all costs. They are changing voting rules, rigging election maps, attacking vote by mail, and using shoddy data in an effort to remove millions of Black and Brown citizens from the voter rolls.

**Despite their best efforts, we will not be silenced.** We are “the people” and we have the power. Let's show up and make sure our voices are heard and our votes counted.

In the current climate, the **866-OUR-VOTE** Election Protection hotline, administered by the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law, is more important than ever.

The Lawyers' Committee was founded over 60 years ago, at the height of the Civil Rights Movement, to ensure the full protection of voting rights for Black people and other people of color, and we're not backing down now. **Whether you call, text, or contact 866-OUR-VOTE** through social media, a trained volunteer will provide you with trusted, nonpartisan information, so that you can vote and have your vote counted.

We decide who represents us. No matter the obstacles coming our way this election, the **866-OUR-VOTE** hotline has your back. We are in this fight with you, ensuring that every person has the voice, opportunity, and power to thrive in their communities.

# MAKE A VOTING PLAN

- ✔ **Confirm your voter registration** status at least a month before Election Day. Visit [866.ourvote.org](https://866.ourvote.org) and select your state page to check your voter registration.
- ✔ **Vote early**, if possible.
- ✔ **If voting by mail**, return your ballot as early as possible – no later than 7 days before Election Day. You may also be able to hand-deliver it to a drop box or your elections office before polls close on Election Day. Call the Hotline to learn about ballot delivery options in your state.
- ✔ **Check your voting location** before you go and allow extra time in case the lines are long.
- ✔ **Visit [866ourvote.org](https://866ourvote.org)** to check ID requirements for your state.
- ✔ **You have the right to vote without intimidation, coercion, or threats.** Immediately report problems to election officials or local law enforcement. Call the Election Protection Hotline to report issues.
- ✔ **Save 866-OUR-VOTE (866-687-8683)** in your phone so you can call from the polling place if necessary.

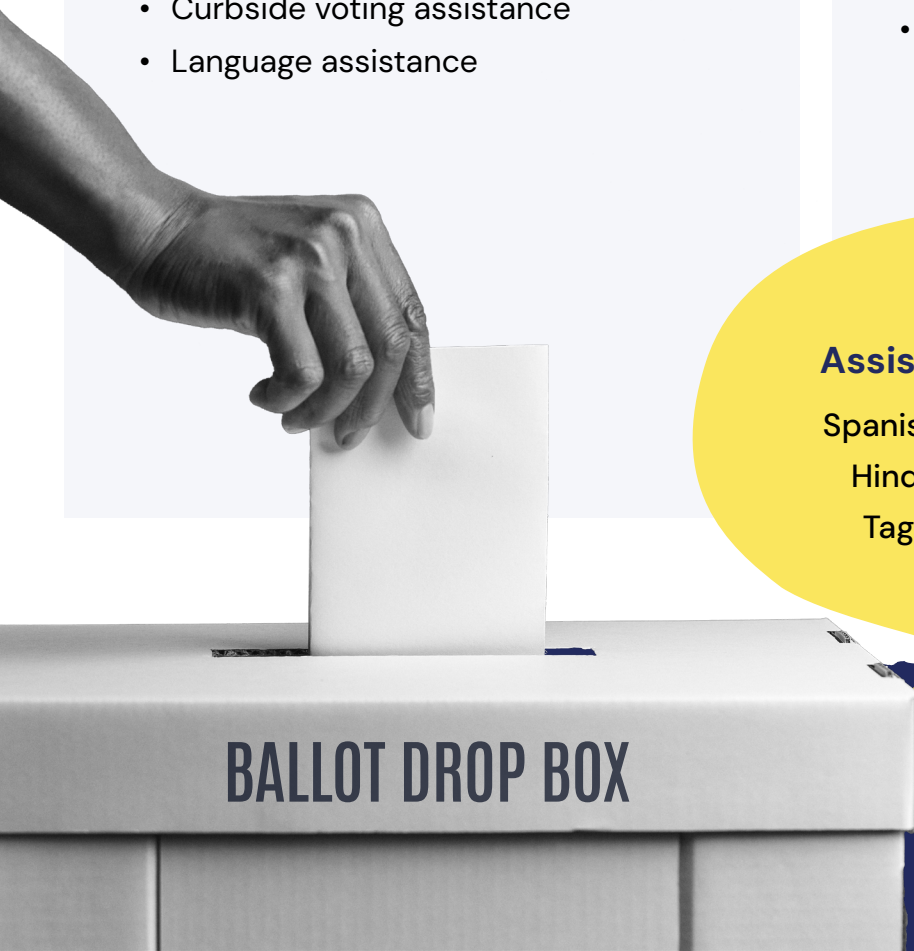
## HERE'S A SAMPLE OF WHAT WE CAN HELP YOU WITH:
